<u>Improving cultural safety: Recommendations for child protection practitioners</u> This short article discusses the importance of cultural safety and provides guidance for non-Indigenous practitioners to create a more culturally safe environment for First Nations peoples. <u>More</u>>

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Communities

<u>Understanding cultural safety for Aboriginal children and young people</u> This guide, developed by the Commission for Children and Young People, helps professionals and organisations working with Aboriginal children and young people to understand cultural safety and how to establish culturally safe environments. It includes practical tips and tools that will help you meet the requirements of Child Safe Standard 1 and make your organisation a safer place for children and young people. <u>More></u>

<u>First Nations women are at greater risk of stillbirth. Here's why – and what we can do about it</u> Australian national data show First Nations women face almost twice the risk of stillbirth or "sorry business babies" compared to non-First Nations women. To address this inequity, Australia's national stillbirth action plan focuses on ensuring culturally safe stillbirth prevention and care for First Nations women. <u>More></u>

NSW Government supports first Birthing on Country program The Minns Labor Government is investing \$21.3 million to create Australia's first Aboriginal-owned, midwifery-led birth centre in Nowra. The Gudjaga Gunyahlamai Birth Centre will provide culturally safe maternity care, improving outcomes for Aboriginal women and families. This initiative supports the Birthing on Country model and complements existing health services in the South Coast region. More>

Special Issue in partnership with the Lowitja Institute: centering Indigenous knowledges

This Special Issue of the Medical Journal of Australia is in partnership with the Lowitja Institute, Australia's only national Aboriginal Community Controlled Research Institute. This inaugural partnership publication has been timed to coincide with NAIDOC week — with the theme "Keep the fire burning! Blak, loud and proud" — and recognises and celebrates Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander leadership and excellence in health and medical research. More>

Implementing the cultural determinants of health: our knowledges and cultures in a health system that is not free of racism Centring ways of being, knowing and doing rightfully places our knowledges and cultures, visibly, in the work that we do as policy actors, who have relational and obligatory responsibilities, to our families and communities, relating to respect, reverence and reciprocity. More>

Postpartum contraception videos for Aboriginal communities developed in partnership with Sydney University, these videos explain why it is important to leave sometime between each pregnancy and how you can use birth control (contraception) after having your baby. They show the different types of contraception. You can also learn where to find support and information to help you make the decisions that are right for you. More>

Looking after bubba for all our mob: Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community experiences and perceptions of stillbirth The stillbirth rate among Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women and communities in Australia is around double that of non-Indigenous women. While the development of effective prevention strategies during pregnancy and improving care following stillbirth for women and families in communities has become a national priority, there has been limited progress in stillbirth disparities. With community permission, this study aimed to gain a better understanding of community experiences, perceptions, and priorities around stillbirth. More>





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Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Communities

<u>Understanding culture and social and emotional wellbeing among young urban Aboriginal people</u> This article looks at the role of connection to culture in the social and emotional wellbeing of urban young Aboriginal people. It considers how practice can support greater wellbeing via connection to culture. It also considers how services can improve their engagement with young urban Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. <u>More></u>

Resources to support culturally safe service delivery to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples a list of resources and organisations that can support non-Indigenous practitioners and organisations in the child, family and community sector to provide culturally safe service responses to Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people, families and communities. More>

"Yarning about Aboriginal Women's Health Business, Taking control of our health – Cervical screening saves lives"

Our Woven Ways: Connecting practitioners with the experiences of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and families Created in partnership with the Menzies School of Health Research and the Aboriginal and Islander Mental Health Initiative (AIMhi), Our Woven Ways encourages non-Indigenous practitioners to challenge the deficit discourse surrounding Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander parenting and use a trauma-informed, strengths-based approach that focuses on the resources, capacities and resilience of families and communities. Coming to terms with the past? Identifying barriers and enablers to truth-telling and strategies to promote historical acceptance This report, published by Reconciliation Australia, aims to advance understanding of what truth-telling is, the key barriers and enablers of engagement with truth-telling and First Nations histories, and implications of these findings for progressing truth-telling in community settings. The report includes considerations for planning and delivery of effective truth-telling initiatives. More>

Ethics in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health research The Lowitja Institute has released a policy discussion paper highlights reforms needed to ensure Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health research is conducted to the highest ethical and governance standards, with the greatest impact on improving health outcomes for communities. Pregnancy and Birth

NSW Mothers & Babies 2022 Find information on the number of births across NSW in 2022, recent trends in the health of mothers and babies in NSW, maternity services provided by hospitals, and the health of Aboriginal mothers and babies. More>

<u>Vaping during pregnancy: a systematic review of health outcomes</u> Smoking during pregnancy is harmful to maternal and child health. Vaping is used for smoking cessation but evidence on health effects during pregnancy is scarce. We conducted a systematic review of health outcomes of vaping during pregnancy. <u>More></u>

Midwifery Pathways in Practice (MidPiP): a hub of information and resources for midwives a hub of information and resources for midwives and those who support midwives. The hub has been co-designed with a diverse midwifery group. Topics include pathway to midwifery, pathway in practice, pathway of leadership, and mentoring in midwifery, as well as tools and resources for education, support, and professional practice for midwives. 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Pregnancy and Birth

<u>Sleep during pregnancy</u> Raising Children Network article looks at the importance of getting enough rest and sleep while pregnant is important for pregnant women's physical, emotional and mental health, as well as for the baby's growth and development. The article covers recommends sleep times and positions during pregnancy and what to expect when sleeping at different stages of a pregnancy. <u>More</u>>

Epidural analgesia during labour and severe maternal morbidity: population based study This cohort study of 567,216 births in Scotland aimed to determine whether epidural analgesia in labour reduces the risk of severe maternal morbidity, and to explore whether this effect might be greater in women with a medical indication for epidural analgesia during labour, or with preterm labour. More>

The relationship between traumatic childbirth and first-time mothers' social identity and wellbeing: a cross-sectional observational study Experiencing childbirth as traumatic is common and can have long-lasting negative consequences for women's mental health. This study investigated the relationship between traumatic childbirth and first-time mothers' social identity and their psychological wellbeing, and more specifically whether strength of identity as a first-time mother protected psychological wellbeing following traumatic childbirth. More>

Barriers and facilitators when implementing midwifery continuity of carer: a narrative analysis of the international literature Midwifery continuity of carer (MCoC) is a model of care in which the same midwife or small team of midwives supports women throughout pregnancy, birth and the postnatal period. In this narrative review and synthesis of the global literature on the implementation and sustainability of midwifery continuity of carer, we identify barriers to, and facilitators of, this model of delivering maternity care. More>

Experiences of antenatal care practices to reduce stillbirth: surveys of women and healthcare professionals prepost implementation of the Safer Baby Bundle SBB aimed to reduce stillbirth rates in Australia through improving pregnancy care across five elements; smoking cessation, fetal growth restriction (FGR), decreased fetal movements (DFM), side sleeping in late pregnancy and decision making around timing of birth. We assessed experiences of women and healthcare professionals (HCPs) with antenatal care practices around the five elements. More>

Infant, Child and Family Health and Wellbeing

<u>Core care conditions for children and families: Implications for policy and practice</u> This report describes the core care conditions that young children, their parents / caregivers and their families need to flourish. Core care conditions are the key features of the social and physical environments in which young children and their families live that are important for optimal development and functioning. More>

<u>'Help way earlier!' – transforming child justice</u> How Australia can transform child justice to improve safety and wellbeing investigates opportunities for reform of child justice and related systems across Australia based on children's rights and sound evidence. The report includes the voices of children and their families, and stakeholder submissions, interviews and roundtables. More>

Positive childhood experiences protect heart health Cardiovascular disease (CVD) contributes to a significant burden of disease worldwide. This makes the promotion of good heart health throughout the life course a major public health priority. Experiences of childhood adversity have been linked to CVD later in life, but less is known about the more immediate effects on child heart health. More>





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Infant, Child and Family Health and Wellbeing

Webinar recording: The Early Years Strategy 2024-2034 Presented by ARACY and the Australian Government, this webinar presented an outline of the Early Years Strategy 2024-2034 and updates on the next steps. The Strategy aims to create a more integrated, coordinated approach to Commonwealth policy and investment in early childhood across Australian Government portfolios to better deliver outcomes for young children aged 0-5 and their families. More>

The effects of adverse and positive experiences on cardiovascular health in Australian children Limited evidence suggests that positive experiences in childhood may promote cardiovascular health, providing additional opportunities for prevention and early intervention. This study aimed to examine the effects of adverse and positive experiences on cardiovascular health in late childhood. More>

<u>Children Australia access to the published archive for free</u> One of the aims of Children Australia is to highlight the diverse evidence that informs practice and policy to support better outcomes for children, young people and families. The journal publishes research evidence, commentary, cultural knowledge and practice wisdom from practitioners, clinicians, academics, researchers, students, policymakers, children, young people, carers, and parents. More>

Barriers and enablers to promoting grandchildren's physical activity and reducing screen time: a qualitative study with Australian grandparents With an increasing number of grandparents providing care to their grandchildren, calls have been made for these caregivers to be considered important stakeholders in encouraging children's engagement in health-promoting behaviors, such as physical activity. Understanding the perspectives of grandparents who provide care is crucial to informing efforts that aim to increase children's physical activity, yet little is understood about their perceptions of specific barriers and enablers to promoting children's physical activity and reducing screen time. More>

<u>Paediatric sepsis</u> This new Lancet Series unequivocally calls for targeting paediatric sepsis as a key contributor to poor health outcomes through strengthened collaboration and tailored initiatives, presents a case for sustainable and scalable quality improvement across paediatric critical care, and proposes a research roadmap to ending sepsis as a threat to child health globally. More>

<u>Improving the safety and wellbeing of vulnerable children</u> This study aims to provide a national focus for reforms to the child protection and youth justice systems by examining the nature of recommendations from 61 reports and inquiries into these systems between the years of 2010 and 2022. <u>More></u>

<u>Father-specific engagement strategies in parenting interventions</u> Understanding how to engage fathers in parenting interventions enables child and family practitioners to better help fathers build their parenting skills and share the responsibility for their child's overall wellbeing. This article summarises key findings from a systematic review on father engagement in parenting interventions, as well as the barriers to father engagement <u>More></u>

Staying healthy: Preventing infectious diseases in early childhood education and care services - 6th edition NHMRC Staying healthy is a best-practice resource that provides simple and effective ways for educators and other staff to help limit the spread of illness and infectious diseases in education and care settings. This edition also includes updated scenarios based on real-life situations that illustrate the key messages and appropriate actions to take. Fact sheets on symptoms and diseases have also been added to the new guideline. More>

Barriers and enablers to accessing child health resources and services: Findings from qualitative interviews with Arabic and Mongolian immigrant mothers in Australia The aim of this study was to explore the resources used and trusted by Mongolian- and Arabic-speaking migrant mothers in Australia for child health information and examine how they navigate and overcome challenges they encounter accessing this information. More>

<u>1800 Respect Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) communities resources</u> aim to help increase awareness of the following key messages: How to access free and confidential support as a visa holder, Domestic and family violence is not just physical, Forced marriage is against the law, Support is available if you feel unsafe. <u>More></u>

Responding to health literacy of refugees in Australian primary health care settings: a qualitative study of barriers and potential solutions. This qualitative study examined barriers to implementing health literacy responsive care practices in primary health care settings in Australia. It also offered suggestions to potentially address the barriers to improving organisational health literacy. More>

2- 8 September 2024 Multicultural Health Week: Celebrate culture through food with multicultural family lunchboxes A healthy lunch can help you and a family have plenty of energy to work, learn and play during the day. Domestic and Family Violence, Trauma, Sexual Assault and Child Protection

<u>The Domestic, Family and Sexual Violence Commission — Yearly Report to Parliament</u> This report presents the Commission's view on progress towards the objectives in the National Plan to End Violence against Women and Children 2022-2032. This report highlights best practice in engaging with people with lived experience and identifies gaps and opportunities for improvements in reaching the National Plan objectives. More>

Recognising and responding to non-accidental injuries in children. This short video assists health workers in NSW to recognise and respond to the signs or "red flags" of non-accidental injuries in children. It is a clear and concise resource that introduces sensitive and complex issues. Viewer discretion is advised. More>

Supporting children and families to flourish Putting human relationships at the centre of transformational reform of the child protection and out-of-home care system in NSW. This report articulates steps to advance a course change on child protection in NSW. It outlines 11 key opportunities to focus the system on the holistic needs of children and towards empowering families and communities through a relational approach to care. More>

Consent Can't Wait Campaign the Australian Government national campaign to help reduce the incidence of sexual violence in Australia by improving community understanding and attitudes on consent and respectful relationships. The campaign helps adults be informed and understand consent, so they feel comfortable and confident having conversations with young people. More>

Engaging with victims and survivors of child sexual abuse: A practice guide for workers and organisations: An Australian Government initiative The practice guide provides evidence-based information and comprehensive resources to help shape how workers and organisations respond to children, young people and adults who are victims and survivors of child sexual abuse. The practice guide aims to assist all workers engaging with victims and survivors, including specialist sexual assault services, generalist service providers and other frontline organisations that engage with children, young people and adults. <u>Child protection Australia 2021–22</u> This is the final update in the Child Protection Australia 2021-22 reports by AIHW. This report presents data on children leaving the out-of-home care system and includes the Permanency Outcomes Performance Framework indicators and National Standards for Out-of-Home Care indicators. <u>More></u>





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Domestic and Family Violence, Trauma, Sexual Assault and Child Protection

<u>Workplace technology-facilitated sexual harassment: Perpetration, responses and prevention</u> Ever evolving technologies in the workplace create new mediums for sexual harassment, and employers and staff need support on how to prevent and respond to the potential harms. This project conducted by a team at Monash University, offers crucial insights to aid Australian employers and policymakers in understanding and combating workplace technology-facilitated sexual harassment (WTFSH) effectively. <u>More></u>

<u>Differential Intervention Outcomes Among Fathers Who Commit Domestic and Family Violence: The Influence of Parental Relationship Status</u> This study from the Journal of Family Violence investigates whether participating fathers improved their co-parenting interactions, family functioning and wellbeing, and considered father characteristics and relationship statuses that coincided with positive outcomes. <u>More></u>

Violence towards refugee and migrant women often goes undetected. We've found a way to help fix that According to the Australian Institute of Criminology, the number of women killed by partners increased by 28% from 2022 to 2023. While the overall homicide rate remains low, the numbers were decreasing prior to 2022. One of the most vulnerable groups in our society are women from refugee and migrant backgrounds. Around one-third of these women are estimated to experience violence from their partners. As they're less likely to disclose, they are also more likely to remain in abusive relationships than other women. More>

Men's behaviour change programs are key to addressing domestic violence this study shows how we can improve them Men's violence against women in Australia is recognised as a national crisis. There is a need to hold perpetrators to account for their abusive behaviour. Men's behaviour change programs are a key component of the broader strategy to hold men accountable for their actions and prevent future abuse. More>

Health checks for women poster a handy guide to the health checks women need, and when to get them. More>

<u>Postpartum contraception videos for CALD communities</u> explain why it is important to leave sometime between each pregnancy and how to use contraception after having your baby. Available in multiple languages. <u>More></u>

Notification rates for syphilis in women of reproductive age and congenital syphilis in Australia, 2011–2021: a retrospective cohort analysis of national notifications data Retrospective cohort study; analysis of national infectious syphilis and enhanced congenital syphilis surveillance data. Women aged 15–44 years diagnosed with infectious syphilis, and babies with congenital syphilis, Australia, 2011–2021. More>

<u>Babies infected with syphilis are part of a growing tragedy – one that could be easily prevented</u> Data just published online shows an increase in infectious syphilis cases in women living in Australia aged 15–44 and a subsequent rise in transmission from pregnant parent to child. Congenital syphilis is easily prevented through timely testing and treatment of syphilis during pregnancy. Left untreated, congenital syphilis can have devastating outcomes in more than 50% of cases including miscarriage, stillbirth, neonatal death and permanent disability. <u>More></u>

The resurgence of congenital syphilis in Australia: novel approaches and sustained, effective public health efforts are required. In the past, syphilis outbreaks have occurred where there is socio-economic disadvantage and health services are unable to provide adequate testing, treatment, and sexual partner management. Reversing the increase in congenital syphilis numbers is achievable only if syphilis control measures are sufficiently targeted and intense to reduce syphilis rates among women of reproductive age. More>

<u>Australia's health 2024: in brief</u> presents a summary of the state of health in Australia, with key findings on the health system, the health of Australians and factors that can influence our health. The report highlights the urgent need for a holistic approach to young people's health. This means investing in mental health support, promoting social and emotional learning, and creating safe and inclusive environments. <u>More></u>

Australia's health visualised The latest biennial report from the Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW) on the overall health of Australians seeks to measure these vital indicators. Among other insights, it shows COVID has had a significant effect on Australians' health. The virus was the third leading cause of death in 2022 - the first time in more than 50 years an infectious disease has been in the top five - and may go some way to explaining why we've not seen an increase in life expectancy since the last report. More>

<u>Women with Disabilities Australia</u> new website co-designed by and for women, girls, feminine identifying, and non-binary people with disabilities. <u>More></u>

A woman-centered approach to weight stigma When promoting or treating a woman's health, focusing on her body shape, weight, or size without considering what impacts her, her access and decision making over time is an act of weight stigma - even if unintentional. Weight stigma impacts one in two women, and can increase stress and depressive symptoms, create disengagement from healthcare and ultimately lead to poorer health outcomes. It is considered one of the last socially and medically 'acceptable' forms of discrimination. More>

<u>Principles for doing trauma informed research</u> This practice guide provides an understanding of what trauma-informed research is, an appreciation of the value of considering trauma throughout the research process, and knowledge of high-level principles of trauma-informed research that can be applied within projects. <u>More></u>

How to do trauma-informed research and evaluation This practice guide outlines strategies and concrete tips for designing and conducting research and evaluation that is trauma informed. It also provides information on the quality and nature of the evidence and research literature that the principles and strategies are based on. More>

Common myths & misconceptions about racism guide Myths and misconceptions often prevent us from having meaningful conversations about race or addressing racism. This guide was developed to support people to build confidence in identifying and thinking critically about things that arise when learning about race and racism in Australia. More>

Information resources for students with disability and their caregivers. The Australian Government Department of Education has released new resources for students with disability and their parents and caregivers. The resources provide practical information about the rights of students with disability and the obligations of education providers under the Disability Standards for Education 2005. The resources were co-designed by people with disability, with help from Children and Young People with Disability Australia (CYDA). More>

With an incidence rate of around 1-2 cases/1000 deliveries and the 2nd highest cause for all maternal deaths, First Nations women and those living in rural and remote areas face higher risks due to disparities in healthcare access with women from lower socioeconomic backgrounds more susceptible due to barriers in accessing timely and adequate prenatal care.
15 Sep - Online	25th Online Breastfeeding Conference: Flourishing covers a wide range of topics to inform and guide clinical practice and to inspire and challenge thinking about breastfeeding, nutrition and human lactation.
